# 2018 Community Health Needs Assessment 2019-2021 Implementation Strategy

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### I. Rehabilitation Hospital of Indiana's Mission

Rehabilitation Hospital of Indiana provides personalized, compassionate care that enables individuals to regain hope and independence after life-changing injury or illness.

### **II.** Purpose of a Hospital's Implementation Strategy

An Implementation Strategy outlines how a hospital plans to address community health needs and is intended to satisfy the requirements set forth in Internal Revenue Code Section 501(r)(3) regarding Community Health Needs Assessments (CHNA) and Implementation Strategy. The Implementation Strategy process is meant to align the hospital's resources and programs with goals, objectives and indictors for how the hospital plans to address identified health needs in the community.


### **III. Description of Hospital**

Rehabilitation Hospital of Indiana (RHI or "the hospital") is an acute care rehabilitation hospital that provides inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services. RHI, located in Indianapolis, specializes in brain injury, spinal cord injury, stroke, and comprehensive medical rehabilitation for injuries resulting in loss of function. RHI has 91 licensed beds and is a community collaboration between Indiana University Health (IU Health) and St. Vincent Health.

RHI is dedicated to the community it serves. The hospital conducts a CHNA every three years to understand current community health needs and to inform strategies designed to improve community health. The CHNAs are conducted using widely accepted methodologies to identify the significant needs of the community served by the hospital. The assessments also are conducted to comply with federal laws and regulatory requirements that apply to tax-exempt hospitals.

### **IV.** Community Definition

RHI's local community is defined as Marion County, Indiana. Marion County accounted for approximately 47 percent of the hospital's inpatient cases in 2017. The total population of the county in 2015 was 938,058. RHI also serves the State of Indiana as a whole. Accordingly, this CHNA also considers relevant community health needs across the entire state. The total population of the state in 2015 was 6,612,768.

### V. Development of Implementation Strategy

This Implementation Strategy was developed by a team of members of senior leadership at RHI representing several departments of the organization, including administration, therapy, nursing, brain injury specialists, researchers, pharmacy, care coordination, finance, ancillary services and community relations.

Each year, senior leadership at RHI will review this Implementation Strategy to determine whether changes should be made to better address the health needs of its communities.

### VI. Community Health Needs Identified

Secondary data, findings from other community health assessments of areas served by the hospital, input obtained from individuals who participated in community meetings, input obtained from key stakeholders, and a community survey were reviewed to identify and analyze the needs identified by each source. The top health needs of the RHI community are those that are supported by multiple data sources.

## VIII. Community Health Needs Hospital Will Not Address

RHI is unable to address those community health needs that do not relate directly to the Hospital's mission to deliver healthcare. These are needs that other governmental agencies and/or community organizations have the most appropriate expertise and resources to address.

RHI is unable to address the following community health needs identified in the 2018 Community Health Needs Assessment:

### Smoking

RHI is unable to address the high smoking rates in Marion County and Indiana as a whole. Other community organizations are currently addressing this need. Additionally, the hospital does not have the expertise and resources to address the issue effectively.

### **Violence and Injuries**

RHI does not have the expertise and resources to impact violence and crime rates in Marion County. Additionally, this need is being addressed by others including Indiana Coalition against Domestic Violence.

### **Increasing Death Rate**

RHI does not have the necessary resources to impact the increase in death rates.

### Training for Physicians and Hospitalists to Better Diagnose Traumatic Brain Injury

The hospital already provides training to physicians and healthcare providers in the community. We do not have the resources at this time to provide additional trainings. RHI also collaborates with BIAI (Brain Injury Association of Indiana) to provide support groups for individuals recovering from a brain injury.

### **High Cholesterol Relating to Stroke**

The hospital does not have the resources to decrease the high cholesterol rates that are contributing factors to stroke. RHI currently collaborates with BIAI (Brain Injury Association of Indiana) to provide support and resources for stroke survivors.
